
Carnivores, Herbivores and Omnivores

Starter


Can you draw a picture of an animal with the things that it likes to eat?

Before we look at the pictures you have drawn, let's learn something about what animals eat.





Herbivores



These are animals that only eat plants.

These can be flowers, fruit, nuts, grass or even wood.



You could remember the word:

Herbivore

by remembering that herbs are types of plants.

Carnivores

These are animals that only eat meat.

These animals have to catch animals to eat.

What do I like to eat?



Omnivores

These are animals that eat meat and plants.

These are animals like chickens that can eat seeds and worms.




You could remember the word

by remembering that omnivores eat everything with an

Can you sort the animals into **herbivores**, **carnivores and omnivores** by cutting the animal cards out and sticking them in the right column?


Remember!

On your whiteboard, write 'true' on one side and 'false' on the other.


Use your whiteboard to say whether these statements are true or false.

A sheep eats grass.




It is a carnivore.
