The painting is Composition VIII by the Russian painter Wassily Kandinsky and it shows how he has used 2D shapes, straight lines and curved lines to create his picture. It is known as abstract art because it uses shape, lines and colour to represent objects.

- 6. Are any of the lines perpendicular?
- 7. Can you find an acute angle?
- 8. Can you find an obtuse angle?
- 9. Can you identify a right angle?
