I sincerely hope you have a lovely half term break. The weather forecast looks as though it's going to be sunny and dry all week.

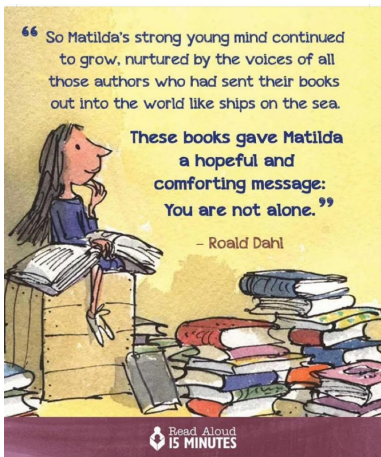
