**LEARNING OBJECTIVE (WALT)**

To understand that:-

- having money gives us choices
- spending money on things we like or like to do can make us happy
- being happy does not rely on money
- we all have different things that make us happy

**LEARNING OUTCOMES (WILF)**

Happiness, worth, value, money, material goods, consumer.

**TEACHING/LEARNING ACTIVITIES**Introduction

Think about these questions (if you can discuss with someone in your family):

You don't need to write all your answers out, just create a simple mind map.

1. What makes you happy?
2. When and where are you happiest?
3. Do the things that make you happy need money?
4. What do we mean by being 'rich'?
5. What amount of money would make you rich?
6. Is it better to be rich or happy?
7. Can being rich make you happy/happier?

**MAIN TEACHING AND LEARNING**Activity 1:

Decide what a 'good day' is for you. What would a good day feel like? How would you know that it had been a good day? Make a list of what makes a good day, e.g. what activities would you do? What would be a good day at school?
