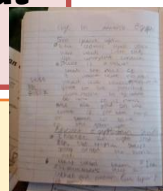

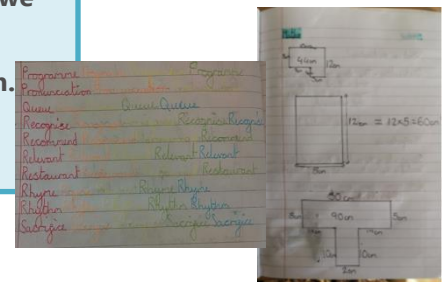
Continuing to celebrate the wonderful work of our pupils at Regis...
