



Through child-initiated, adult-directed, or adult-led learning, pupils make excellent progress in their early years at Regis, so that they are ready to access the national curriculum in our inspiring double size reception classroom.

We understand the importance of a smooth start to

school. Once offered a place at Regis, parents are provided with details of our carefully planned transition programme to ensure that this happens.

At Regis, we have clear expectations of our pupils. These expectations extend to all aspects of pupils' behaviour that promote successful learning and personal development. Our positive behaviour reward system recognises pupils' achievements and successes in all aspects of school life.

Baseline assessments are used in Early Years to establish an academic, personal, social. and emotional starting point. Each child is set aspirational targets for learning and progress toward these targets is closely monitored.

Full and correct uniform is important to generate a belonging to the Regis community and our pupils take pride in the Regis colours and appearance.

The adults in our community are also proud of the role that our pupils play in creating such a positive and strong school identity. Our pupils' commitment and participation stems from our high expectations of them.

Regis operates a house system, based on historic kings who have a connection to Corsham. A number of Inter-House Competitions take place throughout the year, culminating in our Summer Sports Day on our school field which is just over the road from the main campus.



Love of Learning

Our curriculum follows a 2 year rolling programme of essential skills and knowledge mapped out across the year groups to ensure progression. Across our curriculum topics, it is our intent for our pupils to learn:

- 2. About Corsham and their local area
- 3. Through experiences inside and beyond the classroom
- 4. New knowledge and understanding appropriate to their age
- 5. How to keep themselves safe

These 5 intentions underpin our curriculum because we want our pupils to have a love of learning which they can share, a sense of understanding and pride of where they live, and be safe in different situations.

Profound learning is highly valued and our curriculum is supplemented by carefully planned activities such as residential stays for year 6, trips to places of interest linked to topic, theatre tours and even themed days in school, all of which allow pupils to use their imagination and creativity and develop their curiosity for learning.

We offer a diverse range of extracurricular clubs for pupils of different ages to attend, including STEM club, choir, art and construction activities.

Peripatetic music lessons are also available in school.



We strive to continuously listen and respond to the needs of our community; our Academy Pupil Council comprises elected children from across the school and works with teachers to make the school a better place. They attend monthly meetings and are responsible for representing and feeding back to their classmates. Our Year 6 Academy Councillors sit on the Corsham Youth Council giving them the platform to contribute to the wider community.



We understand that every child is different and we need to be flexible in our approach to education.

Wellness and attendance are gateways to learning which has become so much more obvious since the pandemic. Our 'Nurture Room' is part of the school's Inclusion and PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education) provision and it offers children opportunities to re-visit early learning skills and support their social and emotional development. We also offer a dedicated Emotional Literacy Support Assistant and a Thrive Practitioner to work with vulnerable children.
